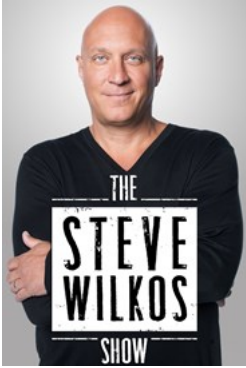

If you haven't tried Ballroom Dance but would like to, come join us for an evening of fun!! Singles and couples are welcome.

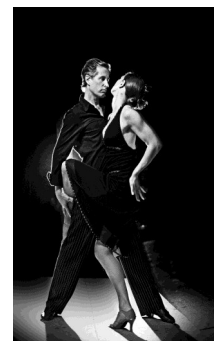

SERVSAFE/QUALIFIED FOOD OPERATOR is an eight hour course to learn the standards in food safety, food-borne diseases and food service sanitation. The successful completion of the exam given at the end of class certifies you as a Qualified Food Operator, which fulfills the Connecticut Public Health Code requirement and is a national certification from the National Restaurant Association.

BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (BLS) FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS

is an American Heart Association course teaches CPR, use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), barrier devices, bag-valve masks and foreign-body airway obstruction relief.

During an incident, emergency personnel may not be able to reach everyone right away. By getting trained in CERT, you will have the skills to help emergency responders save lives and protect property.
