Annual Full-Time Tuition & Fees:

UCONN -- \$13,250

NCCC -- \$4,032

Just earning your A.S./A.A. in two years before transferring to UCONN will save you a minimum of \$18,430 in tuition and fees alone!

FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE IS EXPENSIVE!


For most NCCC graduates, attending a four-year college will be the first time that they will need to borrow money to pay for school.

Student loans are generally a large part of financial aid awards, and need to be repaid, eventually, with interest.

In 2014, the average UCONN graduate, for example, accumulated almost \$25,000 in loans over four years.

BUT I ONLY BORROWED \$25,000!

How to turn \$25,000 into \$30,788 (even if you make every payment in full, on time)



Loan Balance: \$25,000.00

Loan Interest Rate: 4.29%

Loan Term: 10 years

Monthly Loan Payment: \$256.57

Number of Payments: 120

Cumulative Payments: \$30,788.81

Total Interest Paid: \$5,788.81

GAP Admission Requirements


Plan to earn an associate's degree from a Connecticut Community College in **five (5)** years or less.

•Have earned thirty (30) or fewer transferable college credits at the community college at the time of application.

GAP ADVANTAGE 1: GUARANTEED ADMISSION

Academic Requirements

- GAP students are guaranteed admission to UCONN upon completion of their associate degree with a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Specific academic and professional programs (Schools of Business, Education & Professional Studies, and Engineering, Science & Technology) have additional/higher admission requirements.



GAP ADVANTAGE 2: YOU HAVE A DEGREE!


During the remainder of your undergraduate experience, you will have an advantage over students who started at UCONN.

When it comes to applying for jobs and other opportunities, remember:

An Earned Degree > 62 credits

GAP ADVANTAGE 3: LESS TIME TO EARN A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

GAP students enrolled at the Storrs campus graduate more quickly than non-GAP CT Community College transfer students.



GAP ADVANTAGE 4: \$8,000 SCHOLARSHIP

The new President-to-President Scholarship provides \$2,000 per semester, for four semesters, for GAP transfer students.

That's another chunk of change you won't have to borrow and repay!



I'M SOLD! HOW DO I START THE GAP APP PROCESS?

Step 1

Complete a CSCU Community
College application for
admission and submit it, along
with a check for the required
\$20 application fee.


If you're currently an NCCC student, you've almost certainly done this already!



Don't Send Cash!

Step 2

Collect an official copy of your high school transcript or GED, and official copies of transcripts from any previously attended colleges/universities.



Step 3

Complete a Guaranteed Admission application.

Available at **UCONN** website, under Transfer Admissions)

Also available at CSD Transfer Advising.

Non-refundable Application Fee is \$70.00 check.



Never accept a \$70.00 bill!

Step 4

Schedule a a meeting with the NCCC Transfer Coordinator, who reviews your eligibility.

At the meeting, the Transfer Coordinator signs the application, and makes a copy of it.

Finally, **YOU** will mail the completed application and all accompanying materials to **UCONN**.



Be sure to attach sufficient postage!

When you apply to graduate for NCCC, you must complete the Intent to Enroll form and send it to UCONN.

You can get the **Intent to Enroll** form from the **NCCC** Transfer Coordinator.

IMPORTANT DEADLINES:

You must submit the Intent to Enroll form for the Fall semester by March 1st

You must submit the Intent to Enroll form for the Spring semester by October 1st

Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA due by March 1st)

After **UCONN** receives your completed Intent to Enroll form and official community college transcript (as well as official transcripts from any other postsecondary institutions attended), it will send you a formal letter of admission to University of Connecticut.

UCONN will complete a transfer credit evaluation.

THE GAP APP LAST LAP!

Attend the Admitted Student Open House in the **spring**

Attend Transfer Orientation, advising, and register for classes at **UCONN**

Send an **official final transcript** to **UCONN**
