### <u>Course Title:</u> Linguistics of American Sign Language

**Course #:** ASL 205

#### **Course Description:**

A survey of linguistic theories, methods, and research and how it relates to ASL: universals of language, how language is structured, social variation in language, and language change over time. 3 semester hours.

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite: ASL 101, ASL 102, ASL 201, ENG 101

## **Goals:**

To become familiar with the basic concepts of linguistics as they pertain to language in general, and to ASL specifically. These concepts include: phonology, morphology, syntax, and the use of language.

## **Outcomes**:

- 1. To identify general linguistic concepts as they apply to the structure of ASL.
- 2. To demonstrate an understanding of the research in the linguistic structures of ASL.
- 3. To identify aspects of ASL structure and isolate the pattern or rule that governs that structure.
