September 16th- Constitution Day Trivia- Virtual, a link to join will be emailed to students. 12pm Winner will receive a \$25 Amazon Gift Card.






Northwestern Professor Added to Fulbright Specialist Roster Sharon Gusky Professor of Biology.



Winsted, CT — Northwestern CT Community College Professor of Biology, Sharon Gusky, has been approved by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) for placement on the Fulbright Specialist Roster for a tenure of four years.

The Fulbright Specialist Program pairs highly qualified U.S. academics and professionals with host institutions abroad to share their expertise, strengthen institutional linkages, hone their skills, gain international experience, and learn about other cultures while building capacity at their overseas host institutions. As a candidate on the Fulbright Specialist Roster, Professor Gusky is now eligible to be matched with projects designed by host institutions in over 150 countries globally. She will have the opportunity to work with two international institutions over her four-year tenure.

Gusky was competitively selected by a Peer Review Panel to join the Fulbright Specialist Roster based on her significant experience in the field of biology and biology education. In addition to teaching biology at Northwestern, Gusky is the chair of the Center for Teaching for all twelve CT Community Colleges. She was the 2020 President of the National Association of Biology Teachers and served on their board for three years. She has received numerous recognitions for her work in biology education including the ASM Indo-US Professorship Award which sent her to Kolkata, India to teach a short course in Microbiology. She has also received the Connecticut STEM Achievement Award from the Connecticut Science Center, and Connecticut's Professor of the Year award by the Carnegie Foundation and C.A.S.E Foundation. Professor Gusky is a Founding Fellow of the Partnership of Undergraduate Life Science Education (PULSE) program and a founding member and former president of Connecticut Association of Biology Teachers.

"I am very excited to share my knowledge and experience in student-centered learning and undergraduate biology education with science departments abroad," said Gusky. "And I look forward to learning new and exciting things from the institutions that I visit."
