# Northwestern Students Chosen for Hartford Art School Exhibit

Northwestern CT Community College is proud to announce that five of their art students were chosen to participate in the Community: Transfer Student Exhibition at Hartford Art School, University of Hartford in West Hartford.

Natalie Albanese, Darren Arias-Montesino, Daneisha Gomez-Ortiz, Kaylee Naumowicz, and Carol Pelizzari exhibited their work in the show that ran from February 9 through 15 in the Donald & Linda Silpe Gallery.

The annual show invites all twelve of the state's community colleges' art students to submit work for consideration. Students are required to submit a portfolio of ten pieces, as well as an essay, artist statement, and documented faculty support.

"As one of the smallest campuses, we are honored to have five students selected for this prestigious show," said Art Professor Courtney Puckett. "The students selected from Northwestern, as well as the other community college campuses, represent the quality and dedication to their craft our students demonstrate."

Albanese, Gomez-Ortiz, Naumowicz, and Pelizzari are second year students who plan to graduate this spring and transfer to continue their studies. Arias-Montesino is a first-year student who plans on continuing to study at Northwestern







# Northwestern Student Received National Scholarship

Northwestern CT Community College student, Renee Rivera Restivo, has been awarded The Harvey Lincoln Student Scholarship through the national Achieving the Dream organization. The scholarship is a need-based scholarship for community college students who have persisted in their studies despite educational, personal, or financial obstacles. The award is \$2,000. Rivera Resitvo is one of two in the country to receive the award.

"Coming to the college (Northwestern) gave me a voice," said Rivera Restivo. "I felt supported and like there are people out there that care about me as a person and see my struggle and that makes it mean so much."

Rivera Restivo is a returning student pursuing a degree in Health Information Management. She is also involved in many campus activities including the Student Senate, the campus student podcast, The Bookish Club, and is founding member and president of the campus Student of Color Alliance.



"It's so refreshing to see this world in another light," she says. "Like I thought I knew what the world was and what it was about but ever since coming to the college I have learned about a whole new world that I never knew."

Achieving the Dream is a national organization that helps community college students, particularly low-income students, and students of color, stay in school and earn a college certificate or degree.





#### **SNAP E&T:**

Get the Skills to Pay the Bills!



SNAP Employment & Training (E&T) is a free, Federal job training program designed to help SNAP (EBT/food stamp) recipients gain skills to increase financial stability.

If a person is receiving SNAP in Connecticut and is not receiving Temporary Family Assistance (TFA-Temporary Cash Assistance), they may be eligible to participate in nocost job training at any of the CT Community Colleges. Existing students can also apply for assistance with books, uniforms, transportation costs and any other program-related expenses.

SNAP E&T scholarships are offered all year long so it's always the right time to apply!



Use 007635 for your 2023-2024 FAFSA.

If you are applying for federal financial aid for the Fall 2023 semester and beyond, please use Federal School Code 007635 on your 2023-2024 FAFSA. While this Federal School Code will initially identify as Capital Community College on the FAFSA, please know that the US Department of Education will update the college name in Summer 2023.

If you do not list Federal School Code 007635 on your 2023-2024 FAFSA, we will be unable to process your financial aid application for the Fall 2023 semester and the 2023-2024 academic year.

The 2023-2024 FAFSA is available on October 1, 2022, at fafsa.gov. For more information, contact your Financial Aid Office.
